throughout the entire Church in the Middle Ages because he was reputed to have miraculously cured a little boy who nearly died because of a fishbone in his throat. From the eighth century he has been invoked on behalf of the sick, especially those afflicted with illnesses of the throat. A general blessing of the throats will be given at the end of Mass and after Mass you may come up to receive an individual blessing. Anyone can receive this blessing, Catholic, non-Catholic, in a state of grace or not. This is not communion or a sacrament it is a sacramental so come!

As I have told you before, one of the most important comments I get from people is "Father, I pray for you every day." - There is nothing that means more to me! Know, that I am also always praying for you every day at my daily Mass and holy hour, and I will see you next Sunday, God willing! Remember that I love you -
