Praised be Jesus Christ!

Happy Eater to all of you and a special welcome to all those who are visiting our Church – we are so glad that you are here! Know you are ALWAYS welcome to our parish family!

Again - Happy Easter! Finally, it is Easter! I love Easter! As I tell you every year on Easter morning, I watch the movie "The Greatest Story Ever Told" and I forward it to the part of the movie on Easter Morning after Jesus has risen from the dead. It is a great scene. It is early in the morning and the apostles wake up to the gentle Halleluiah Chorus. It then it builds, and they run to find the empty tomb, and everyone is excited, happy, and filled with great hope!

So, I remind you again that we make the Easter Proclamation: "Jesus is risen! He is risen indeed!" This was the greeting of the early Christian community when they met one another they knew that the core of our faith is we are the people of the resurrection. In the 400's St. Augustine would proclaim: "We are Easter people and alleluia is our song!" We ARE an Easter people! We need to focus on Jesus and His resurrection and not just on us and the crucifixion! I would encourage you to make this very practical just like you do for Lent. What I mean by this is just like you deny yourself something for the 40 days of Lent you then need to do something every day during the 50 days of Easter to show that you are an Easter person. That is, bring hope to the hopeless, bring peace to those who need it, and bring life to those who are struggling! Also, do something each day to enjoy the gift of life that God has blessed you with. Now yes, we all know that this world is not our home, heaven is, but you can enjoy the journey home!

I want to welcome Izzie who has received the Spirit for the first time in Baptism, and Bryce who received Him in a fuller way through the Sacrament of confirmation at the Easter Vigil. 


