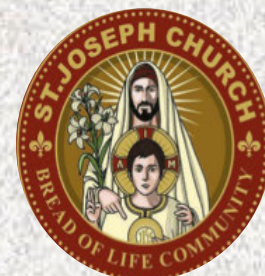

### 4th Sunday of Lent – Laetare Sunday

To my Family of Sacred Heart (St. Paul) and St. Joseph/BOL Parishes,

**THE PASCHAL FEASTS APPROACH:** Holy Week and the Paschal Triduum are days of unequalled importance for Catholics - and truly - for every human being of all times and all places. I am nervous, but energized, to celebrate my first Holy Week as your pastor. My prayer is that these sacred days may bring us each closer to Christ, and that they may bring us closer to each other as brothers and sisters in the Lord. If you have personally experienced the breadth of the Paschal feasts, you know and understand how powerful they are. If you – as an individual or as a family – have never been in church for the Triduum days, I not only invite you to attend, I beg you to be with us this year. On Holy Thursday, we join Christ in the Upper Room as he gives the Church the sacraments of Holy Orders and the Eucharist. On Good Friday, we share with Christ the pain of his passion, and we solemnly venerate the Holy Cross on which hung the Savior of the world. At the Easter Vigil, in the darkness of Holy Saturday night, we light the Paschal Fire, listen to the stories of our salvation, and jubilantly celebrate the resurrection of Christ from the grave. Also at the Easter Vigil, we will be welcoming four new Christians, each of them to be baptized, to be confirmed, and to receive their First Holy Communion during the course of the Mass. A fifth young man will receive his Confirmation. What joy for us as a parish family! Please, move heaven and earth to be with us during these days. Please, mark April 17-19 on your calendar with bold letters. By putting God ahead of our other interests, especially when we must sacrifice to do so, we make a bold statement that the Christ is first in our lives. Thank you! I look forward to these most holy of days!

**COME TOGETHER:** What do our bible study, our recent parish mission and our family dinners all have in common? Unity! Folks from all three of our churches are stepping beyond the confines of their “own” building - and in good numbers - coming together with the larger parish family. The result? Purposeful and joyful events that can be confidently described as successful. Praise God! I’m seeing this as well at our weekend Masses. Kids from St. Joseph Bread of Life are altar serving at Sacred Heart and St. Paul. On Saturday evenings at St. Paul, there is almost always a healthy contingent from the other churches. And throughout this Lent, Friday night Stations of the Cross have been located at Sacred Heart, but St. Paul and St. Joseph Bread of Life regulars have been enthusiastically participating. Excellent! This is our way forward. One of the strategic anchors that the Parish Leadership team is using to make decisions is: “One Parish Mindset.” Operating in a silo, caring only about *my church*, clinging to what needs to change – these are ingredients for a dying faith community. Moving forward together is the way to a vibrant parish family. I say it again, “Praise God!” And thank you to YOU!

**SOUND AND LOUD:** JB Sound has completed the work of upgrading the sound system at St. Joseph Bread of Life (although we are still tweaking the ambo mic settings to give it the richest sound possible). Work is now beginning at St. Paul. Because the configuration of the Sacred Heart sanctuary makes it difficult to provide good hearing, that space requires the most work, and it is the most expensive as well. Sacred Heart will be the last of our churches to receive new sound, but the hope is to have everything completed by late spring or early summer. Please remember that this 3-church project is meant to be paid for by an overflow of CSA contributions. If you have not given and you are able to do so, we would be most appreciative.

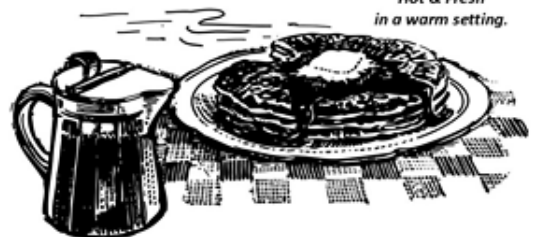

**Kinship Korner News  
Easter Basket Collection**



As Easter approaches this year, we will again help Community Shelter Services (CSS) by collecting Easter basket items for the homeless and at-risk children in their programs. The dead line for donations is April 13th. The following items are requested: **Easter baskets, individual size wrapped Easter candy, small toys such as stuffed animals, Hot Wheel cars, coloring books, crayons, or any other small item you think a child would like to find in their basket. We already have enough "Easter grass". If you already purchased some, we will still take it.** This collection was a great success last year and we thank you for your donations. ALL items can be placed in the storage totes marked Kinship in the entryways of St Paul and St Joseph Bread of Life churches or in the Kinship box located under the Holy Family statue at Sacred Heart. OR dropped off at the church office.

**Helping our Current families of Refugees**

We recently learned that the International Institute (USCRI) on East 26<sup>th</sup>, also engaged in refugee resettlement, will remain open until the end of September. We are working with the USCRI to provide baskets of household items in our stock and any food that remains from SH Food Pantry after Sacred Heart food pantry has served their clients. This ministry allows the refugee families to use their financial resources for rent as newly arrived refugees cease to receive financial assistance for only 3 months after arrival. We already know of one family that has been evicted because of inability to pay their rent.

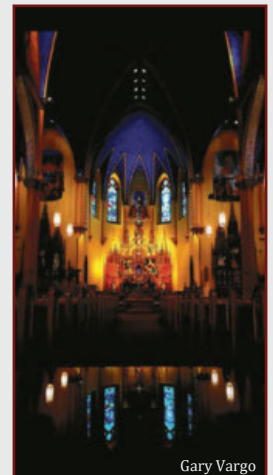

## Deacon Dabblings

### DO YOU SEE WHAT I SEE?

The other night I was getting ready for bed and as I was looking in the mirror I said to my wife, I can't believe how much I have aged. I've got love handles the size of bowling balls, my hair is gray and thinning, I've got more wrinkles than a roll of crepe paper, hair growing out of my ears, I can't hear without hearing aids, and I am blind in my right eye. Isn't there one positive thing that can be said about me? My wife's answer: at least the eyesight in your left eye is perfect.

Even though our Liturgical Year is Year C, during Lent those churches that have Catechumens who will be baptized at the Easter Vigil use readings from Year A, therefore our Gospel passage this weekend is from John, the man born blind. The story of the man born blind is a story for our day and our time. There are several important issues in our world today about which we do not see clearly. Some of those issues include hunger, homelessness, the marginalized, and the ostracized among the many.

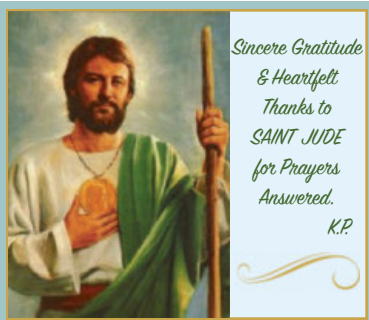
The man born blind is a story of a journey from darkness to light. His journey is our journey, a journey from spiritual blindness to faith, a journey of believing in Christ. For most of us, our journey to recognize Christ in our lives comes about slowly. When we look upon the crucifix do we see a tortured, convulsed, and pitiful victim, or do we see the Son of God? When we look at the water in the font, do we see just ordinary water, the same water that flows from the faucets of our homes, or do we see water which transforms lives and changes souls forever? When we look at those on welfare, those standing in line using food stamps, those on Medicaid, do we see the poor who are responsible for their miserable lot, or do we see the face of Christ? When we look around us at those who are disabled, those with physical and psychological limitations do we try to ignore them instead of seeing Christ?

American sociologist, Tony Campolo told a story in one of his books about a time when he was teaching a class and was trying to get a discussion going. He asked the class what some of the world's great religious leaders might have said about prostitution. They talked about Buddha's views, Mohammed's views and the views expressed in the Torah. Finally, he asked the class, "And what do you suppose Jesus would have said to a prostitute?" A Jewish student answered, "Jesus never met a prostitute." Tony immediately answered, "Yes he did. I'll show you in the Bible where..." But the student interrupted him, saying, "Doctor, you didn't hear me. I said Jesus never met a prostitute. Do you think that when he looked at Mary Magdalene, he saw a prostitute? Do you think he saw prostitutes when he looked at women like her? Doctor, listen to me! Jesus never met a prostitute. He met a daughter of God." When Campolo heard that, he realized that the Jewish student understood Christian theology better than he did. So Campolo ends his account of this incident by writing, "To be a Christian is to learn to see people as Christ sees them."

So how will you choose to see the world? Through Christ's eyes or your own? Like the man born blind, each of us has been given a vision of how the world could be. Will we accept that vision and allow it to guide the way we live and the way we interact with others?

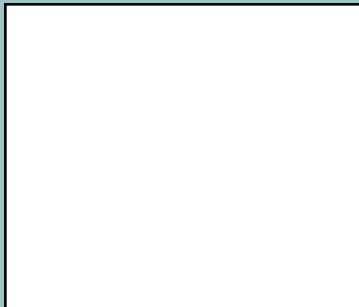

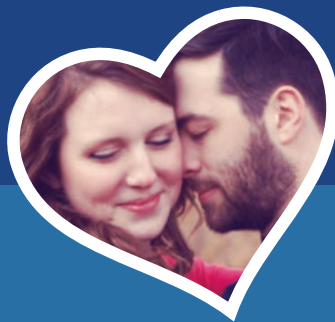
