## Third Sunday of Lent

To my Family of Sacred Heart (St. Paul) and St. Joseph/BOL Parishes,

**MISSION ACCOMPLISHED:** God is good! All the time! I thank the good Lord and you for the blessings from this past week's Parish Lenten Mission. Thanks to all who attended and all who participated. Thanks to our mission-driven parish staff for their support and hard work. Thanks to our musicians and altar servers. Thanks to Clint and Stacey for providing the "Kids' Track." Thanks to our liturgical ministers and screen operators. Thanks to those who prepared our St. Joseph celebration. Thank you, Jesus!

**A HOPEFUL UPTICK:** A recent Pew Research Center study offers evidence that the decline of religious practice in the United States may have leveled out. Possibly, the number of people practicing their faith may even be rising. If true, this is excellent news, is it not? As I talk with Catholic friends, we share a cautious optimism that the Holy Spirit is moving. Maybe more accurately – because the Holy Spirit is *always* moving and working – we are hopeful that people are more readily responding to the Spirit's call. Pope Benedict XVI (and I quote this often) warned that there is a price to pay when we push God beyond the horizon. It's easy to see evidence of that price: broken families, wars, conflict, anxiety, unhappiness and the like. Could people be recognizing the brokenness of our world, and with the help of God's grace, turning again to the Church? Please God, this is the case. Jesus Christ is the answer to the deepest desires of the human heart. Let's pray that our hearts are open to his presence.

**NON-PROFIT PROGRESS:** I've written previously about the initiatives occurring in our parish family to transform our buildings, and in a profound way, uplift the poor and troubled of our neighborhoods. Here is an update. Regarding the Sacred Heart School building, preparatory work to turn the structure into apartments similar to the Mercy Center for Women housing (in the old Holy Rosary School building) continues to take place. The non-profit leaders who are spearheading this effort are very good at what they do. Nonetheless, such efforts do take some time. Closer to completion is the work currently underway to hand over the St. Paul Italian Festival to non-profit leadership. I am excited about this. The leaders of this initiative (headed by Tim NeCastro) love St. Paul's and they have deep roots in the neighborhood. They are committed. Not only will this effort help to ensure the continuation of the Festival in the long run, but the non-profit will also take over ownership of the St. Paul rectory and the social center. The ultimate goal is an ambitious one: to bring new vitality into Little Italy. Please keep these efforts in your prayers.

**24 HOURS FOR THE LORD:** Pope Francis' worldwide Eucharistic initiative – *24 Hours for the Lord* – takes place at the end of this week, March 28-29, at our own St. Peter Cathedral. Our parish family has generously committed to take part. The adorers from the Adoration Chapel will be doing their hours of prayer during the 24 hours at the Cathedral. Members of our parish Knights of Columbus will be manning our assigned 9:00-10:00 pm time slot. Other members of our parish will be in the Cathedral for our 10:00-11:00 am Saturday morning slot. And I will be hearing confessions at the Cathedral from 8:00-10:00 pm on March 28. This is a wonderful opportunity for Lenten prayer and devotion!

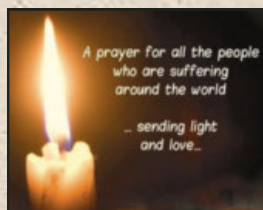

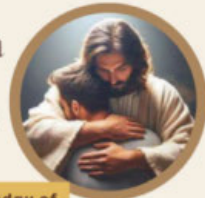

**Easter Basket Collection**



As Easter approaches this year, we will again be helping Community Shelter Services (CSS) by collecting Easter basket items for the homeless and at-risk children in their programs. The dead line for donations is April 13th. The following items are requested:

**Easter baskets, individual size wrapped Easter candy, and any small toys** such as stuffed animals, plastic toys, Hot Wheel cars, coloring books, crayons, or any other small item you think a child would like to find in their basket. We are no longer requesting "Easter grass" as a non-parishioner already donated 100 bags to the CSS. If you already purchased some, we will still take it. This collection was a great success last year and because of that, they requested our assistance again this year. These items can be placed in the storage totes marked Kinship in the entryways of SPs or SJ/BOL or in the Kinship box located under the Holy Family statue at SH.

**May God Lead Us Forward**

Due to a cessation of funding for refugee resettlement, Catholic Charities closed down their entire resettlement program on March 17<sup>th</sup>. The International Institute or USCRI on East 26<sup>th</sup> street, the other Erie agency engaged in refugee resettlement will remain open for maybe a month or 2 more because of a monetary donation they received. Kinship will be seeking guidance from the mosques and other cultural centers in Erie as to how we can help them help these families. We are also currently working with the USCRI while they remain open to provide baskets of expendable household items we have in stock and any appropriate food that remain at our Sacred Heart food pantry after all their clients have been served to families identified as being in need by the USCRI. God, continue to guide us as cannot give up our efforts to live out Matthew's gospel message to welcome the stranger, feed the hungry, and cloth the naked. We will keep you posted as to how God guides Kinship moving forward.

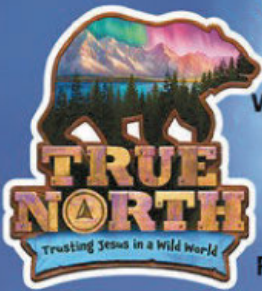

## Deacon Dabblings

**BELATED HAPPY ST. PATRICK / ST. JOSEPH DAYS**

This past week we celebrated the feast days of two great saints. On March 17<sup>th</sup>, St. Patrick's Day was celebrated with two desires in mind; that the flow of green beer would never end and that we have seen the last of winter snowstorms. On St. Joseph's Day, the celebrants also had two desires; that the food would be decadent and plentiful and that St. Joseph, being a carpenter, would keep Canadian lumber prices manageable. These two saints are also well-known Patrons of two proud nations, Ireland (Pat) and Italy (Joe). I am sure that you have all surmised by my last name that I am Italian, actually, Sicilian (Italian on steroids). So, let me start by saying that I have no animosity towards the Irish. Even though my wife is one-quarter Irish, I hold no grudge against all of those from the *Emerald Isle*. I even like corned beef and cabbage, but not too often. When I was a kid, every year, the good sisters of Saint Joseph told all of us little Italian-American boys and girls that everyone was Irish on St. Patrick's Day. We would all wear green, cut out little shamrocks and paste them in our scrap books. All great fun.

St. Patrick holds a special place in the hearts of the Irish. According to the legend, he brought Christianity to the island, made the shamrock fashionable and freed Ireland from snakes. The Irish look upon Patrick as the Apostle to Ireland. A little-known fact about St. Patrick is that one of his patronages is to engineers. He received a Roman education and knew advanced Roman engineering concepts. He taught the Irish to build arches using lime mortar instead of dry masonry. St. Patrick is usually represented with a serpent or snakes around his feet, referring to the legend of his driving the snakes out of Ireland with his shillelagh. His role in engineering and isn't celebrated on St. Patrick's Day. However, his engineering legacy lives on at Missouri University of Science and Technology, where "Knights of St. Patrick" among the engineering faculty celebrate his accomplishments through a series of traditions during the week of St. Patrick's Day.<sup>1</sup>

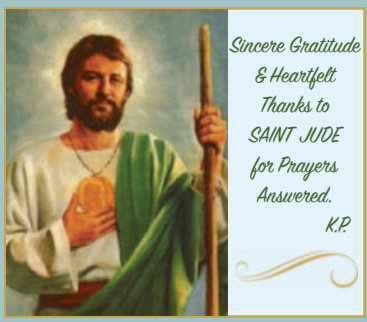
Two days later, is the Feast of St. Joseph. All the Italian kids would wear red, and the Sisters of St. Joseph were ready to party. The day has special significance to the Italian people, especially those of us from Sicily. In the 12th Century, a drought had struck the island causing a famine. The Sicilians prayed to Saint Joseph to save them, promising to always honor his name. When the rains finally came the people made good on their promise. To this day, wherever Sicilians have settled, you will find St. Joseph celebrations with tables filled with food.

With the understanding that St. Patrick was an engineer, and St. Joseph a carpenter, we can see that both saints are builders. I stress this because during this period of Lent, we work at building our relationship with God. The Sacraments are the building blocks of our spiritual life, especially the Sacrament of Reconciliation. As we prepare for Holy Week, let's follow the example of these two saints, as we build up our relationship with Christ and our relationship with one another.

So, to all my Irish friends and family, a belated happy St. Patrick's Day. I enjoyed the corned beef and cabbage, and I even started the day with a bowl of *Lucky Charms* for breakfast.

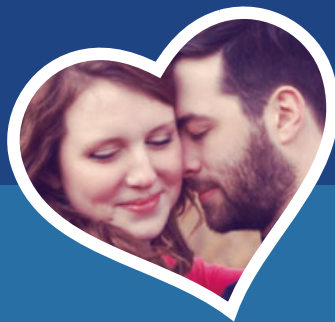
