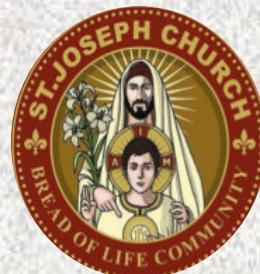

Sunday of Our Lord's Passion (Palm Sunday)

To my Family of Sacred Heart (St. Paul) and St. Joseph/BOL Parishes,

THE DAYS OF OUR SALVATION: 2,000 years ago, the days of Holy Week changed the world's trajectory. The human race was enslaved by sin and condemned to death, but the Paschal Mystery – the suffering, death and resurrection of Jesus Christ – won for us freedom and life. What wondrous love this is! We begin today to recall those precious days, with the entrance of Christ into Jerusalem. Sadly, many of those who cried out "Hosanna in the highest" would soon be calling out for Christ's crucifixion. Maybe you or I would have done the same. We now know – the cross is our trophy of victory - and we too must pick up our cross and carry it. You and I cannot treat Holy Week like any other week. Christ calls us to participate as the Church remembers and ritually recalls the moments of Christ's triumph. Please be with your brothers and sisters as we celebrate the Mass of the Lord's supper on Holy Thursday evening. The washing of feet will take place, the Roman Canon will be prayed, the Eucharist will be processed, and the altar of repose will be available for silent adoration deep into the night. On Good Friday afternoon, the Passion gospel will be read, the solemn intercessions will be chanted, and the cross will be exulted. Holy Saturday will see us lighting the Easter fire, chanting the profound words of the Exultet, baptizing new Christians, and rejoicing in our Lord's resurrection. **I – with love – challenge you to be present each of these days.** Parents, please bring your children. Let them experience the grace of these days. God is so good to us. May we generously offer him our time and our presence. As a parish family, let us be together (all of us!) to celebrate Holy Week.

REPENT AND BELIEVE: I speak often about the Sacrament of Reconciliation because it is such a tremendous gift from God, and because, as sinners, we desperately need forgiveness. The Sacrament is a true encounter with the mercy of God. It is, in fact, an encounter with Christ himself. I go to confession often. The saints themselves are known for regularly using the Sacrament. Please, you go too. If it has been a long time, do not be afraid. Yes, it can be a humbling experience to admit our sins, but it is also a healing experience. This week, I will be in the confessional on four different occasions: (1) Wednesday at St. Joseph at the regular time, 4:45 – 5:45 pm; (2) Holy Thursday from 12:00 – 2:00 pm at St. Joseph; (3) Good Friday at St. Paul after the service; and (4) Holy Saturday at Sacred Heart from 1:00 – 2:00 pm (the normal time). Other priests will also be adding extra times. Do not fear. Go and be set free from sin!

IN THE GARDEN WITH CHRIST: As he entered into his passion and sweat blood in the Garden of Gethsemane, our Lord begged his disciples to stay awake and watch with him. Jesus asks the same of us. Upon the completion of the Mass of the Lord's Supper this Thursday evening, we can indeed pray with Christ and keep watch as he suffers. Prayer before the altar of repose in St. Joseph church will take place until 11:00 pm in the evening. Other churches in Erie will also be open for prayer and it is a wonderful devotion to travel from church to church. I used to do that when I was assigned to Mercyhurst Prep. Please, if possible, spend some time with the Lord in Gethsemane.

ALL FOR YOU: Finally, as we travel through these days of Holy Week, remember that all our Lord did, he did for you. Jesus Christ came to this earth for you! He lived for you! He suffered for you! He died for you! And wonder of all wonders, he rose from the dead for you! Have a beautiful and fruitful Holy Week. I will see you in church!

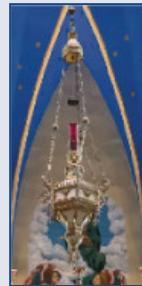

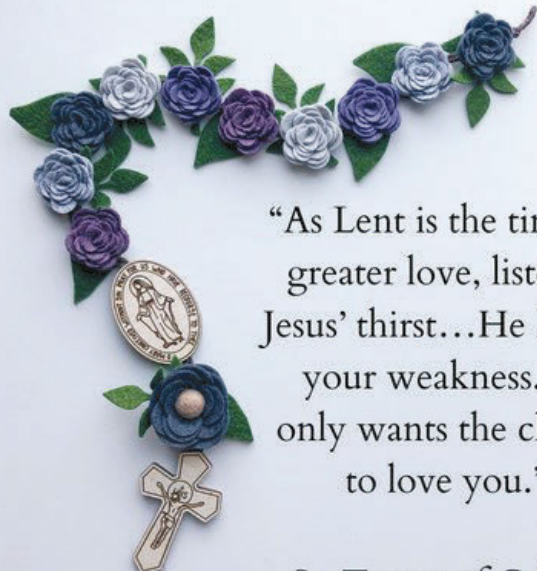

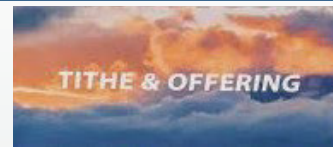

Child Abuse Prevention Month - Reporting Child Abuse:

It is every adult's moral responsibility to report known or suspected abuse or neglect of a minor to the responsible authorities. Physical and sexual abuse of minors are pervasive societal problems, and only concerted and sustained efforts by all adults in every segment of society can help to protect children and youth. In the 2023 Pennsylvania statewide report there were 5,129 substantiated reports of child abuse. 1,749 or 34.1% of the substantiated reports were for sexual abuse, 1,350 were physical abuse. Parents remain the persons most responsible for abuse of their children. *To report child abuse, call Childline at 1-800-932-0313 (anytime 24/7). For particular questions on reporting abuse in the Diocese of Erie, you may call the Office for the Protection of Children and Youth at 814-824-1195.*

Deacon Dabblings

REVENGE

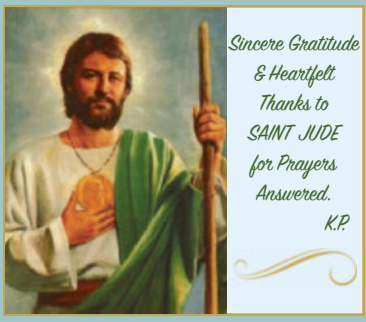
Jennifer's wedding day was fast approaching. Nothing could dampen her excitement, even though her parents had gone through a nasty divorce. Her mother had found the perfect dress to wear and would be the best-dressed bride's mother ever! A week later, Jennifer found out that her father's new young wife had bought the exact same dress! Jennifer asked her to exchange it, but she refused. "Absolutely not," she replied, "I look like a million dollars in this dress, and I'm wearing it." Jennifer told her mother who graciously said, "Never mind sweetheart, I'll get another dress." After all, it's your special day." a few days later, they went shopping and they found another gorgeous dress. When they stopped for lunch, Jennifer asked her mother, "Aren't you going to return the first dress, after all, it was quite expensive, and you have no other place to wear it?" She just smiled and replied, "Of course I have someplace to wear it dear. I'm going to wear it to the rehearsal dinner!"

Revenge! Everyone wants to see their adversaries get their come-up-ins. The familiar Gospel of the woman getting caught in the act of adultery is a good example of this. Although the theme behind this parable is forgiveness, what stands out in my mind is revenge. In this gospel, we are told that the crowd was holding stones in their hands ready to throw them at the woman. But when Jesus said, "let the first among you who is without sin cast the first stone," the people in the crowd knew that it wasn't justice that they were seeking. No, it was revenge! Let's picture ourselves as part of the crowd. Although nowhere in the Gospel does it describe the number and the kind of stones that the people were holding, I would like to focus on 3 stones. The first stone to consider is the one that we are holding getting ready to throw. It can be the stone we want to throw when we maliciously judged another person. I know I've done it. Maybe you didn't really feel like judging that person, but you went along because of peer pressure. Let's hold that stone in our hand and think about all the times we wanted to throw it. This is a stone whose weight you may still feel in your hand and in your heart. Now drop it!

The second stone can be the one we caught when someone sat in judgment of us. That stone and others like it left wounds and bruises, many of which still cause us pain. Those stones and the pain they caused have shaped a portion of our lives and sometimes even shaped our own self-image. As we hold the stone this time, think about a time when somebody sat in judgment of you, for whatever reason. Take the stone you're still holding and, in your mind, flip it over and you will see that, judgment and being judged, are two sides of that same stone. Let that stone also drop out of your hand!

The third stone is going to look a bit different than the other two stones. The third stone is white, and it is light in weight, in fact, you can hardly tell you are carrying it. This is the stone of forgiveness! This is the stone of humility. This is the stone we must carry throughout our lives, for this is the stone of a new beginning draped in compassion and humility. There will come a time when we will all face God, just like the woman in today's Gospel; standing before God, vulnerable, with our sins exposed. I suspect we will not want what we deserve. Lucky for us that God tempers justice with mercy. Let's ask ourselves, what stones am I carrying?

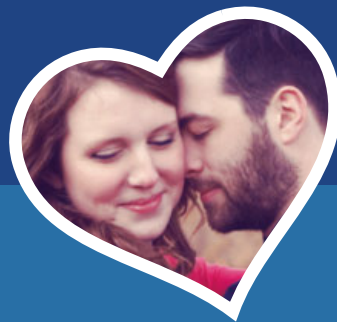
